



TRIO Upward Bound at Bloomsburg University

### TRIO Upward Bound Website

- A FREE Program for Eligible High School Students Considering College.
- It's not just a summer camp. It's not just an after-school program. It's a holistic college preparatory program for income eligible high school students who will be the first in their families to earn a bachelor's degree.
- Upward Bound (UB) is a **federally-funded TRIO** college access program designed to provide eligible high school students with the skills and motivation necessary to succeed in high school and attend college, ultimately leading to their successful completion of a two- or four-year degree (associates or bachelor's). The program is active year-round and hosts a six-week long Summer Academy on campus each summer which provides students with a simulation of what college life is like as they live in a residence hall with a roommate, eat meals in the campus dining hall, and take enriching academic and elective classes taught by high school teachers in actual college classrooms.
- Funded entirely by a grant from the United States Department of Education, Bloomsburg University's Upward Bound program, which is one of around 960 UB programs nationwide, has been continuously funded at Bloomsburg University since 1978 and serves eligible students in **grades 9-12** at **eight local target high schools** (Berwick, Mahanoy, Milton, Mount Carmel, North Schuylkill, Pottsville, Shamokin, and Shikellamy) located in Columbia, Northumberland, and Schuylkill counties of Pennsylvania.
- Services are provided **free of charge** for eligible students. Students who participate in Upward Bound are under no obligation whatsoever to attend Bloomsburg University.
