

CSTAG is a team approach to threat assessment that focuses on problem solving and violence prevention.

If a threat is communicated, the threat assessment team will do an assessment using the School threat Assessment Decision Tree to determine to be seen and how to respond to it.

What is a threat?

A threat is any expression of an intent to harm someone. Threats may be spoken, written, or expressed in some other way, such as through gestures. Threats may be direct or indirect and vague or implied.

Any type of threat as well as the following offenses must be reported to a building administrator immediately:
